Residencies: 'The LeWitt Residency is prestigious and sought-after. Irene is one of the first international artists, either male or female, to be spending a lengthy period in the actual location of his studio, home and personal collection. The duration of her residency is necessary for the scope and ambition of her project. We at the LeWitt Collection, and the family, welcome her to embark on this new body of work and a publication series that will reflect and expand upon her experience of Sol and his art. Irene's contributions will be of utmost importance to understanding Sol LeWitt's influence on a younger generation, and will strengthen the ties he formed in Australia from 1974 - 2007' (J. Passehl, Curator, LeWitt Collection and Archive, USA) Concentric Influences of Sol LeWitt: Foundations, Pivots and Concentric Place; Ten Countries, 2023-2026. International research exhibition: 'Sol LeWitt and his legacy have influenced generations of artists in most countries of the world. This exhibition series proposes an examination of LeWitt's influence on selected artists from ten global regions. An established nucleus of four female artists from the USA, Netherlands and Australia, whom LeWitt played a pivotal role in their practice and life, form the central nucleus of the exhibition series. Ten selected artists from concentric regions of each exhibition hub, will be curated into each iteration. An original Sol LeWitt wall drawing will be selected by Barberis in discussion with each Director/Curator and made available in each venue. The LeWitt wall drawing will be constructed by selected local artists and students. Interviews from each artist selected to be part of the exhibition program, will become part of the scholarship on LeWitt, and a selection published in volume two of the LeWitt/Barberis publications. All the research material will reside in the LeWitt Collection in the form of published volume/s and a folio of documents. Barberis has been working in LeWitt's Chester Studio in 2019 and 2022, including his European studios, the Mahler/LeWitt studios in Spoleto, and his private studio in Praiano, researching his painting processes, studio methods and the synergies in their works.' I Barberis. Personal and In-kind funding to date, approximately \$120,000 USD.

1998, 2017,2020: *The Tapestry of Light Project: The Tapestry of Light* artwork is a research project that has spanned 20 years. It is the first full Apocalypse cycle in tapestry form by a female artist to date. It purposes to define the role of 'light' in a modern exploration of the classical iconography of the 'Last Days.' Framed by the key 14th-century artwork, the 'Angers Tapestry', the research is located at the intersection of artistic design, science and perception of illumination and colour, medieval culture and imagery. The resulting creative work in its exhibited form asks: Can new intersections with female thought and the Apocalypse and scientific perception, open new domains of understanding through the immersive qualities of such an artwork? *The Tapestry of Light* artwork is an immersive 3.2 x 36 metre full cycle contemporary Apocalypse Tapestry, constructed from traditional and fluorescent threads, and new polymer threads of cutting-edge Nanoparticle

phosphorescent science, developed by scientist Prof. David E. Mainwaring. It is a light-forming, responsive tapestry in which the perception of the images evolves as the light environment changes. It was woven on a jacquard loom by Flanders Tapestry, Belgium, and includes in it's fourteen panels, major historical paintings by Barberis (4 and 6 mts), 84 images from the full cycle of the Angers tapestry re-drawn and re-miniaturised in a 21st century setting. It gives new knowledge in its re-presentation of the Apocalypse to a 21st century audience, and in its art and science foci, expression, and knowledge transfers between Medieval Europe to present technologies.

The actualising of these exhibitions followed Sol Lewitt's implementation of ideas through groups of students/young artists/mature team.
